## ANNUAL REPORT (2024-25)

### HIGHLIGHTS

---

S.B. Patil Public School organises a wide range of events, special assemblies, and celebrations throughout the academic year. These occasions, which involve students, faculty, parents, and alumni, contribute to knowledge sharing, transparency, and the development of an understanding of culture, tradition, values, and opportunities.

1. At the start of the 2024-25 academic year, the school conducted Parent Orientation Programmes for parents of students from Nursery to Grade XII. These sessions were designed to familiarise parents with the academic, co-curricular, and extracurricular curricula, classroom environments, and their roles and responsibilities, while addressing any queries or concerns they had.
2. We are pleased to announce that S.B. Patil Public School has been awarded the *Institution of Happiness for 2024-25* Award by QS I-Gauge. This prestigious recognition was conferred upon the school in November 2024.
3. The NABET audit took place on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of January 2025. The audit team visited our campus to evaluate all aspects of academics, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, and administration.
4. Parent-Teacher Interviews (PTIs) and Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs) were conducted following every assessment. These provided opportunities for parents to visit the school, meet with subject teachers, and discuss their children's progress.
5. Special assemblies were held for significant days, celebrations, and events, including Marathi Bhasha Diwas, Independence Day, Republic Day, Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti, Founder's Day, Diwali, Christmas, and more. Students showcased their talents through skits, dances, poetry, story recitations, and film screenings that highlighted the importance of each occasion.
6. Mass assemblies and flag hoisting ceremonies were held on national holidays such as Independence Day and Republic Day. The Head of School, Vice Principal, Headmistress, Administrative Manager, and coordinators participated in the flag hoisting. Parents, EPTA members, and alumni were invited as guests, and students compered the event, presenting patriotic songs and dances.
7. The school's Annual Programme for 2024-25 commenced on 18<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> December, 2023. The Annual Days event provided a platform for students to display their talents while celebrating another school year. The event spanned four days, with each day dedicated to different grade groups:
  - a. Day 1 (18th December): Annual Day for the Pre-Primary section themed on Celebrating Childhood
  - b. Day 2 (19th December): Annual Day for Grades I and II themed on Rang Tarang
  - c. Day 3 (20th December): Annual Day for Grades VI to VIII themed on Bhavsarita
  - d. Day 4 (21st December): Annual Day for Grades III to V themed on Panchakosha

8. The school organised field visits, industrial tours, educational trips, and picnics to help students gain insights into career opportunities across various sectors, develop empathy through visits to orphanages and old-age homes, apply classroom learning to real-world contexts, and enjoy a day of fun and leisure.
9. The school's Career Cell conducted counselling sessions for students in Grades IX to XII to assist them in making informed decisions regarding their course selections. Some of these sessions were also guided by alumni, acting as mentors. Additionally, in collaboration with VIOSA, the school organised psychometric testing for students to assess their strengths, interests, and passions, as well as for faculty to help them career-wise.
10. Periodic medical check-ups were arranged through partnerships with local hospitals. Doctors and hospital staff visited the school to conduct check-ups for students, faculty, and staff. The school nurse and counsellor also organised periodic sessions on physical and mental health.
11. Regular mock evacuation and reverse evacuation drills were carried out by the school's Emergency Response Team to ensure that both students and staff are prepared for emergencies.
12. Guest speakers, including parents, psychologists, dietitians, doctors, and members of the police force, visited the school to address students, parents, and faculty on various topics such as safety, cybersecurity, menstrual health, hygiene, dental care, financial literacy, adolescent issues, communication skills, and diet.
13. Green initiatives like e-waste collection, cleanliness drives, and rallies, along with activities under Roots and Shoots, were led by students under the guidance of teachers.
14. Twinning programmes, best practice sharing, and benchmarking visits were regularly conducted. These visits allowed students and faculty to interact with and learn from other schools in the community, promoting knowledge exchange and helping establish benchmarks for teaching methodologies.
15. At the end of each month, Colour Days were held to teach pre-primary and primary students about different colours, their natural sources, uses, and significance.
16. Various miscellaneous events and celebrations, such as Grandparents' Day, Goodie Foodie Day, Bagless Days, hosting the ULLAS Nav Bharat Saksharta Karyakram Examination, in-house and CBSE faculty training sessions, and programmes on diet, POCSO and POSH workshops, were organised to support the holistic development of students, professional development of teachers, and the overall growth of the institution.
17. Student-led activities were organized for all classes from Nursery to Grade XII, offering students a chance to take ownership of their learning, build leadership skills, and collaborate with peers. Activities such as presentations, debates, and creative workshops encouraged student engagement while fostering communication, responsibility, and confidence. Teachers acted as facilitators, providing guidance while allowing students to explore different roles and develop their abilities in a supportive environment.
