



The changed pattern will help those students who don't wish to continue Math in higher studies and this will lower study burden as well



Curriculum with an Objective of Reducing Stress among Students

TERM I Examination (As Already followed during A.Y. 2021-22)

At the end of the first term, the Board organized Term I Examination which was scheduled during November-December 2021

Each Subject Question Paper did have Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ) including case-based and assertion-reasoning type MCQs. Duration of test was 90 minutes and covered the rationalized syllabus of Term I only (i.e. approx. 50% of the entire syllabus).

Question Papers were sent by CBSE to schools along with marking scheme

The exams were conducted under the supervision of the External Center Superintendents and Observers appointed by CBSE

The responses of students were captured on OMR sheets, after scanning were directly uploaded at CBSE Portal.

Changes in Curriculum will lead to lesser stress on students

TERM II Examination (To be followed in A.Y. 2021-22)

At the end of the second term, the Board will organize Term II or Year end Examination based on the rationalized syllabus of Term II only (i.e. approximately 50% of the entire syllabus)

This examination will be held around April & May 2022 at the examination centers fixed by the Board

The paper will be of 2 hours duration and have questions of different formats (case-based/ situation based, open ended- short answer/ long answer type)

In case the situation is not conducive for normal descriptive examination, then a 90 minute MCQ based exam will be conducted at the end of the Term II also

Marks of the Term I and Term II Examination will contribute to the final overall score

- 1. Students are expected to maintain a high standard in their general behaviour and manner of speech.
- 2. It is compulsory for students to wear the school identity card daily.
- 3. Medium of instruction and conversation should be English, except the language periods.
- 4. Students should greet the teachers and other staff members, whenever they meet them.
- 5. All students should take honest pride in keeping the school premises clean. Litter should be put into the bins provided for the purpose.
- 6. Eating on the stairs and/ or in the corridors is not permitted.

- 7. Students should have deep respect and dedication towards their work.
- 8. Attentiveness and regularity in Grade assignments and homework needs to be given due importance.
- 9. Students are expected to take care of their books, notebooks and belongings, and not tear out pages.
- 10. Care must be taken of all school property. Students must not scribble and write on books, desks, walls or any school property and/or carve names in the woodwork. All damages must be reported to the Grade teacher/principal. In case of damage to school property, a fine will be charged & the cost of repairs will be borne and recovered from the pupil.

- 11. 75% attendance is compulsory for promotion to the next grade and it shall be followed across all levels and grades.
- 12. Attendance is mandatory on the re-opening day and the last working day of the term.
- 13. Absence from school for mere social functions is highly discouraged.
- 14. It is required that students do not miss out on any kind of subject enrichment sessions and evaluations due to trivial reasons.
- 15. In case a child shall remain/ has been absent from school, parents are expected to send a proper note with reason in the school diary.

- 16. Any kind of jewellery and other valuable ornaments are not allowed in the school. Girls are permitted to wear small studs in the ears. However, they shall not be allowed to wear dangling earrings, fancy chains, anklets etc., and they need to refrain from applying nail paints.
- 17. Girls need to have two plaits/ ponytails depending on the hair length. The wearing fancy hairpins, hair bands, *gajras* and flowers in the hair is strictly forbidden.
- 18. Being applicable to boys as well: fancy, stylish haircuts are not permitted under any circumstance.
- 19. On birthdays, no gifts are to be distributed among students and staff, and the distribution of sweets must also be avoided. However, students can donate a book to the library or a sapling as a gesture of goodwill and celebration.
