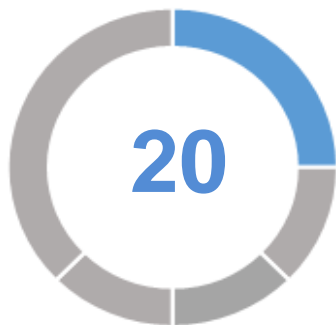
SCHOOL DIARY & ANNUAL PLANNER

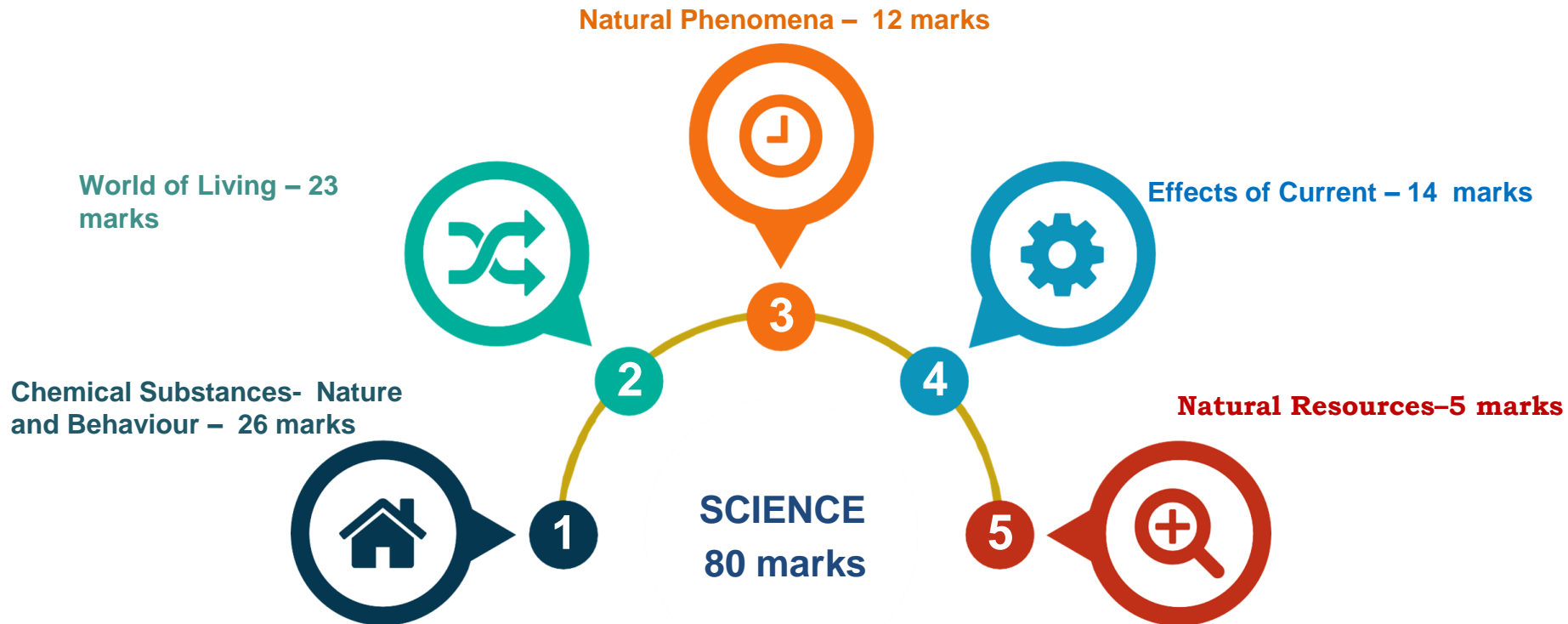


Change in Math exam pattern

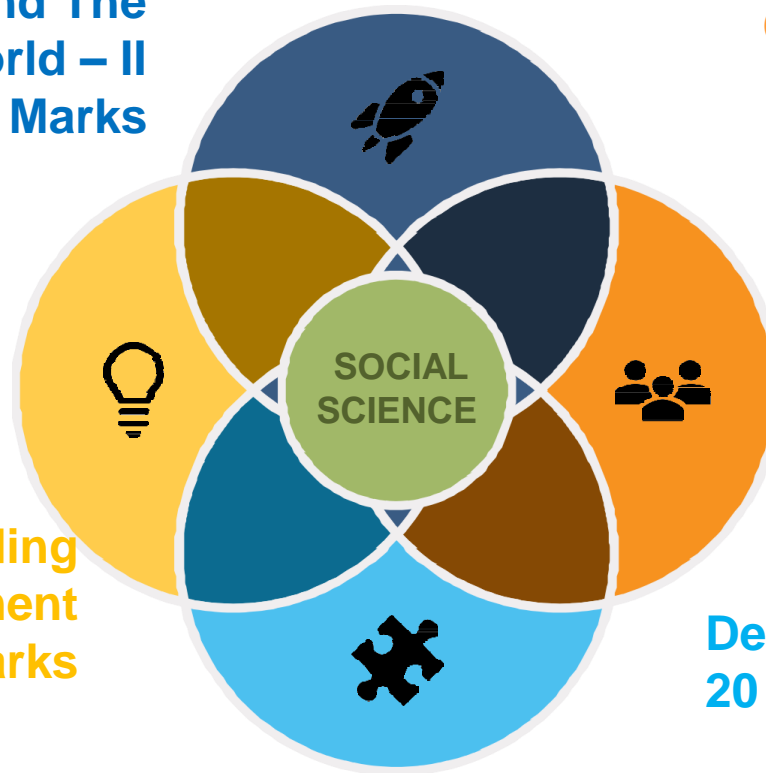

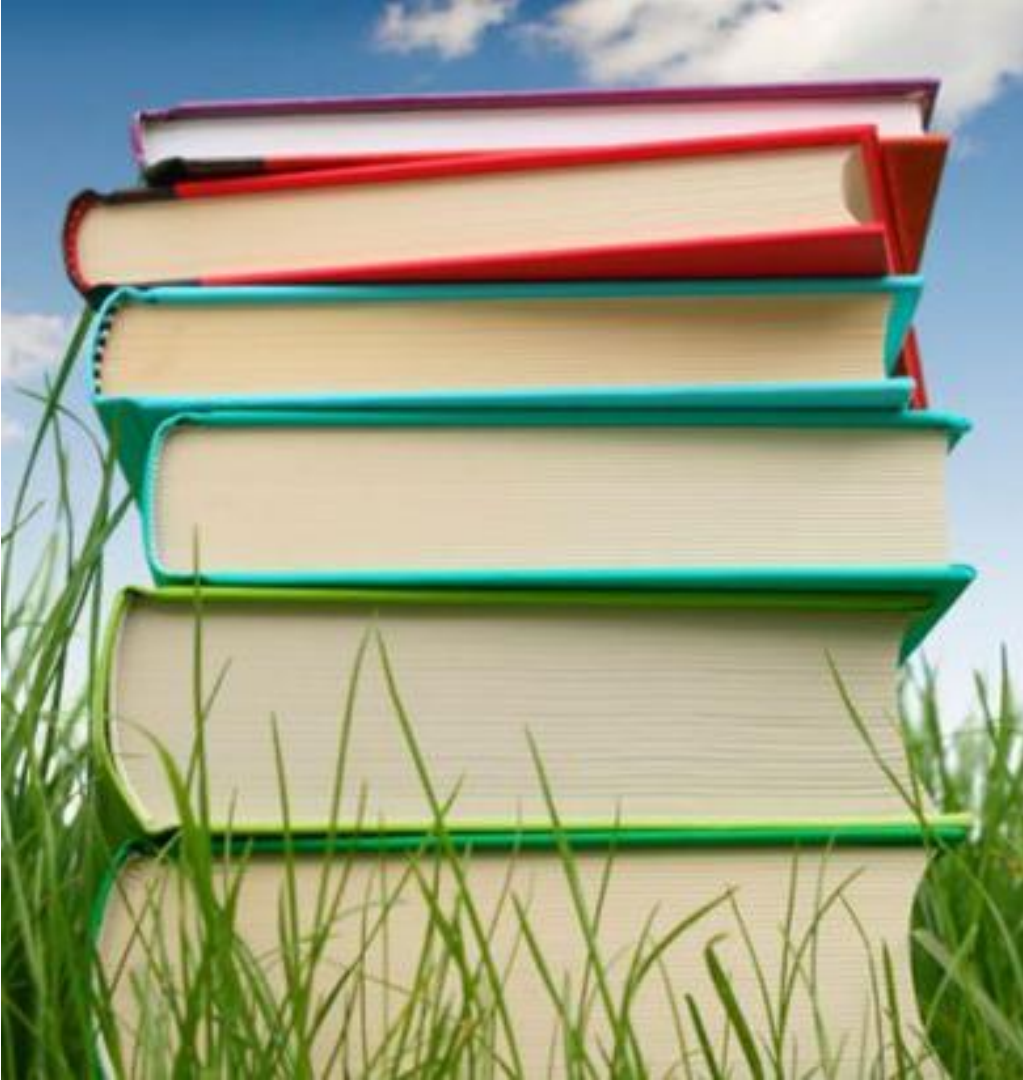

GENERAL DISCIPLINE (A.Y. 2025-26)

1. Students are expected to maintain a high standard in their general behaviour and manner of speech.
2. Students must bring their school diary daily along with textbooks and notebooks as per the timetable to avoid heavy bags.
3. It is compulsory for students to wear the school identity card daily.
4. Medium of instruction and conversation should be English, except the language periods. Marathi language is taught from Grade I onwards.
5. Students should greet the teachers and other staff members, whenever they meet them.
6. All students should take honest pride in keeping the school premise clean. Litter should be put into the bins provided for the purpose.
7. Eating on the stairs and/ or in the corridors is not permitted.

8. Students should have deep respect and dedication towards their work.
9. Attentiveness and regularity in Grade assignments & homework needs to be given due importance. In case any evaluation is missed out (except due to medical reason) no student shall be permitted to appear for a retest and that too with a proper supporting document.
10. 75% attendance is compulsory for promotion to the next grade and it shall be followed across all levels and grades. Attendance is mandatory on the re-opening day and the last working day of the term.
11. Absence from school for mere social functions is highly discouraged.
12. Students must take care of their books, notebooks & belongings, and not tear out pages.
13. In case a child shall remain/ has been absent from school, parents are expected to send a proper note with reason in the school diary.

14. Care must be taken of all school property. Students must not scribble and write on books, desks, walls or any school property and/or carve names on the benches. All damages must be reported to the Grade teacher/principal. In case of damage to school property, a fine will be charged and the cost of repairs will be borne and recovered from the pupil.
15. In case any student reports late to the school for 3 days, then during the 4th late coming, the said student shall be sent back home and parents need to come to school to fetch their ward.
16. Any kind of jewellery and other valuable ornaments are not allowed in the school. Students need to refrain from wearing dangling earrings, fancy chains, anklets and applying nail paints.
17. Girls need to have two plaits/ ponytails depending on the hair length. Wearing of fancy hairpins, hair bands, *gajras* and flowers in the hair is strictly forbidden. For boys, fancy, stylish haircuts are not permitted under any circumstance.

18. On birthdays, no gifts and sweets are to be distributed among students and staff. However, students can donate a book to the library or a sapling as a gesture of goodwill and celebration.
19. The internet and the various applications are a lot of fun and a wonderful tool.....maximize the benefits and reduce the risks.
20. Proper school uniform needs to be worn by the students at all times. In case of non- availability of uniform parents need to send a note in the school diary.
21. Parents need to attend all Online/Offline PTMs and Open Houses to avoid any last minute difficulties and the anxiety.
22. Students are not permitted to ride the geared scooters/ bikes and which need a proper driving license. However, bicycles can be used for the commuting purpose.
23. Students are strictly prohibited from bringing mobile phones and other electronic gadgets to school. If found these shall be confiscated.

24. Use the school ERP for all kind of communication. Change the password regularly to avoid any kind of misuse/threat.
25. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is not allowed.
26. No class parties with regards to celebrations for students and staff can be held in the school premises.
27. Students using the school bus will maintain proper discipline in the bus.
28. Parents and guardians may meet the teachers during the specified time/ or as per the appointment. Whenever you receive a call/message to meet school staff, you are expected to respond/meet the staff.
29. For all kind of services- Transport, Canteen etc. you are requested to contact the school Admin Manager in the admin bay.
30. Career Counselor shall be available for all kind of career guidance.

SPECIAL NOTE FOR PARENTS

- Parents are expected to be role model for their children. Please don't become a victim of anxiety yourself.
- Keep talking to the teachers of your child, it will give direction to your thoughts and planning.
- Encourage your child to perform just a little bit better than the last time.
