Pune, Maharashtra | 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> December, 2025



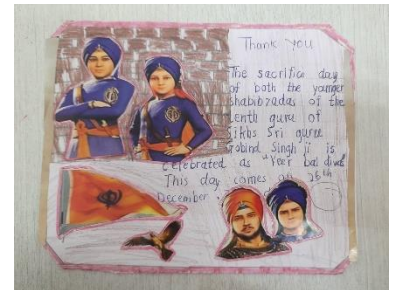
