

Celebrating the Four-Day Annual Programme

S.B. Patil Public School's Annual Programme for 2024-25 was held from 18th to 21st December, 2024. The school's Annual Day is an event that provides a platform for students to not only exhibit their talents on stage but also to celebrate another successful year of learning.

The event spanned four days, with each day dedicated to different grade groups:

- **Day 1 (18th December):** Annual Day for the Pre-Primary section
- **Day 2 (19th December):** Annual Day for Grades I and II
- **Day 3 (20th December):** Annual Day for Grades VI to VIII
- **Day 4 (21st December):** Annual Day for Grades III to V



Each day's event was a culmination of months of preparation, with nearly every student and faculty member involved in working towards the successful start, execution, and completion of the programme.

Themed on "Celebrating Togetherness," the Annual Days featured four distinct sub-themes:
