

The Grades III to V Creative Writing Competition

Pune, Maharashtra | 13th December, 2025



S.B. Patil Public School organised a Creative Writing Competition for students of Grades III to V on Saturday, 13th December, 2025. The competition aimed to nurture young minds by encouraging imagination, originality, and confident self-expression through the written word.

The initiative provided students with a meaningful platform to explore their thoughts creatively while strengthening their language skills. By engaging with age-appropriate themes, students were able to experiment with vocabulary, sentence construction, and storytelling in an enjoyable yet structured manner.



For Grade III, students were given themes such as *If I could talk to animals, I would...*, *The day my toys came alive...*, and *The best picnic ever with my school friends...*, with a word limit of 80 to 100 words. Grade IV participants wrote between 100 and 150 words on imaginative prompts including *The robot who wanted to go to school*, *If I were a teacher for a day*, and *If I had a magical bicycle*. Grade V students explored deeper narrative ideas within the same word limit through themes like *Book characters I'd like to meet*, *A talking tree that needed my help*, and *What if I could pause and rewind time?*

Through this competition, students demonstrated their ability to generate and organise ideas creatively, use appropriate vocabulary, and construct meaningful, grammatically sound sentences. The activity also contributed to improving spelling, punctuation, and overall language accuracy, while boosting confidence in written communication.

Participants were required to select one topic from the themes provided for their respective grades. The entries were evaluated by the school's English teachers on the basis of ideas, organisation, word choice, sentence structure, and grammar usage.

The results of the competition were as follows:

1. For Grade III, Riyansh Bhalekar secured the first position, followed by Advika Kokate in second place and Priyal Lingayat in third place.
2. In Grade IV, the first position was awarded to Anay Singh, with Swara Amlapure securing second place and Priyanshi Pal standing third.
3. For Grade V, Spandan Gupta achieved the first position. The second position was jointly secured by Vihan Takale and Srushti Khasnis, while Varad Pol was awarded third place.

The Creative Writing Competition proved to be an enriching experience, reinforcing the school's commitment to fostering language skills, creativity, and a lifelong love for writing among its students.
